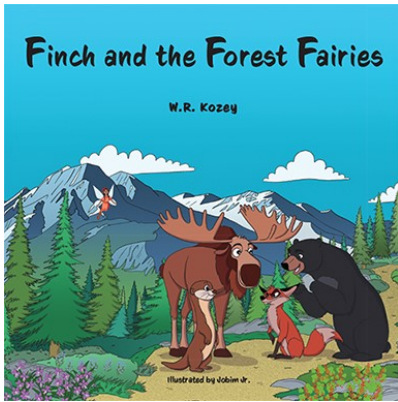


What to do if you encounter a real black bear...



- **Stay calm!** Talk calmly to the bear to let it know you are a human, not prey. Tell it to back away. Remember that most bears just want to be left alone.
- **Never run** away from a bear. It will chase you and it can run much faster than you, up to 30 miles per hour!
- Make yourself look as large as possible: stand up straight, slowly wave your arms.
- **Slowly back away**, and keep an eye on the bear.

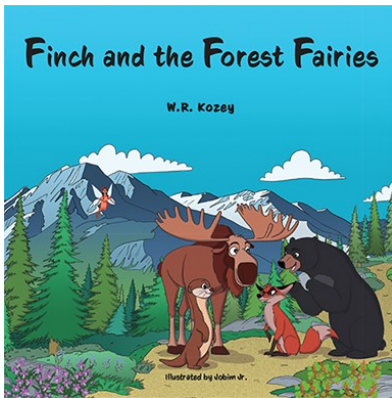

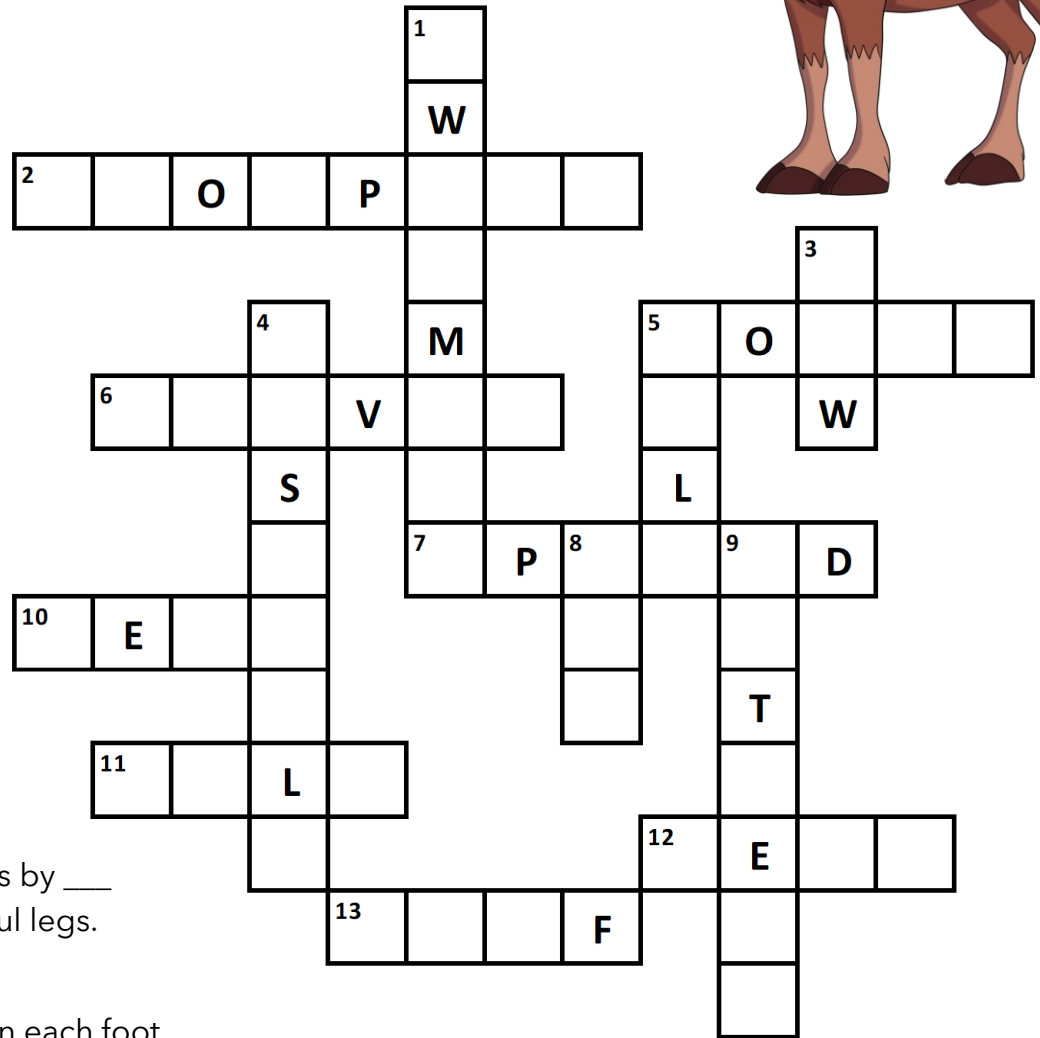

What to do if you encounter a moose...

- **Stay calm!** Back away from the moose. They might look like gentle giants, but an agitated moose can charge and stomp faster than you expect, especially if it is a mother with a baby.
- **Watch** for signs of agitation: ears laid back, hair on the hump standing up, stomping the ground, snorting, head tossing. It's telling you that you are too close.
- **If it charges, RUN!** Put something like a tree or other object between you and the moose. Once you are far enough away, it will leave you alone.

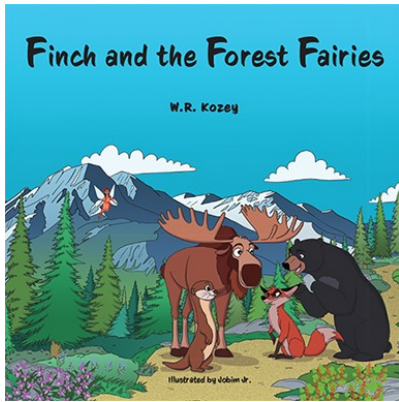

FUN FACTS

- The **hump** on a moose's back is caused by the massive shoulder muscles needed to hold up its big head and antlers.
- Moose hair is **hollow**, which helps insulate them in the cold winters.
- Moose are able to close their nostrils under water.
- The dangling flap under a male moose's chin is called a **dewlap**.
- WATCH OUT! If a moose points its ears backward, stomps the ground or raises the hair on its hump, it means it is getting agitated.

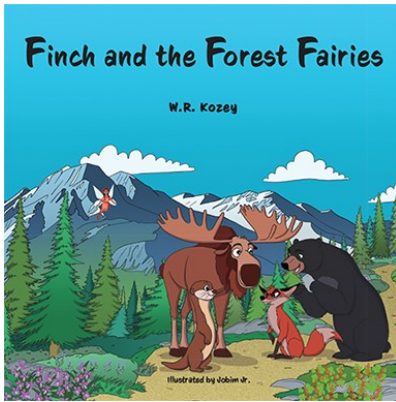

FUN FACTS ABOUT RED FOXES

- Male foxes are called **dogs**, females are called **vixen**, and babies are called **kits**.
- Red foxes are known for their reddish coat, white-tipped tail and black "stockings."
- They can have other color variations though, like gold, silver, and black. The cross fox even has a black or brown cross pattern on its back.
- A litter is usually 4-8 kits and can have multiple color variations in the same litter.
- Foxes have excellent hearing and can hear rodents digging far underground.
- They are great jumpers, sometimes jumping 6 feet high!

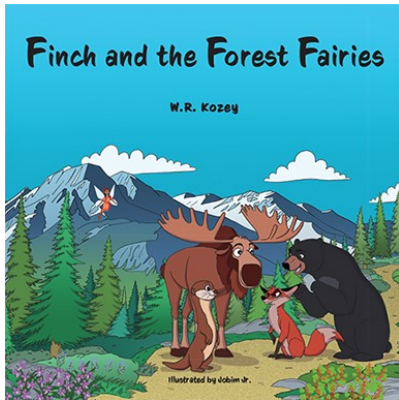

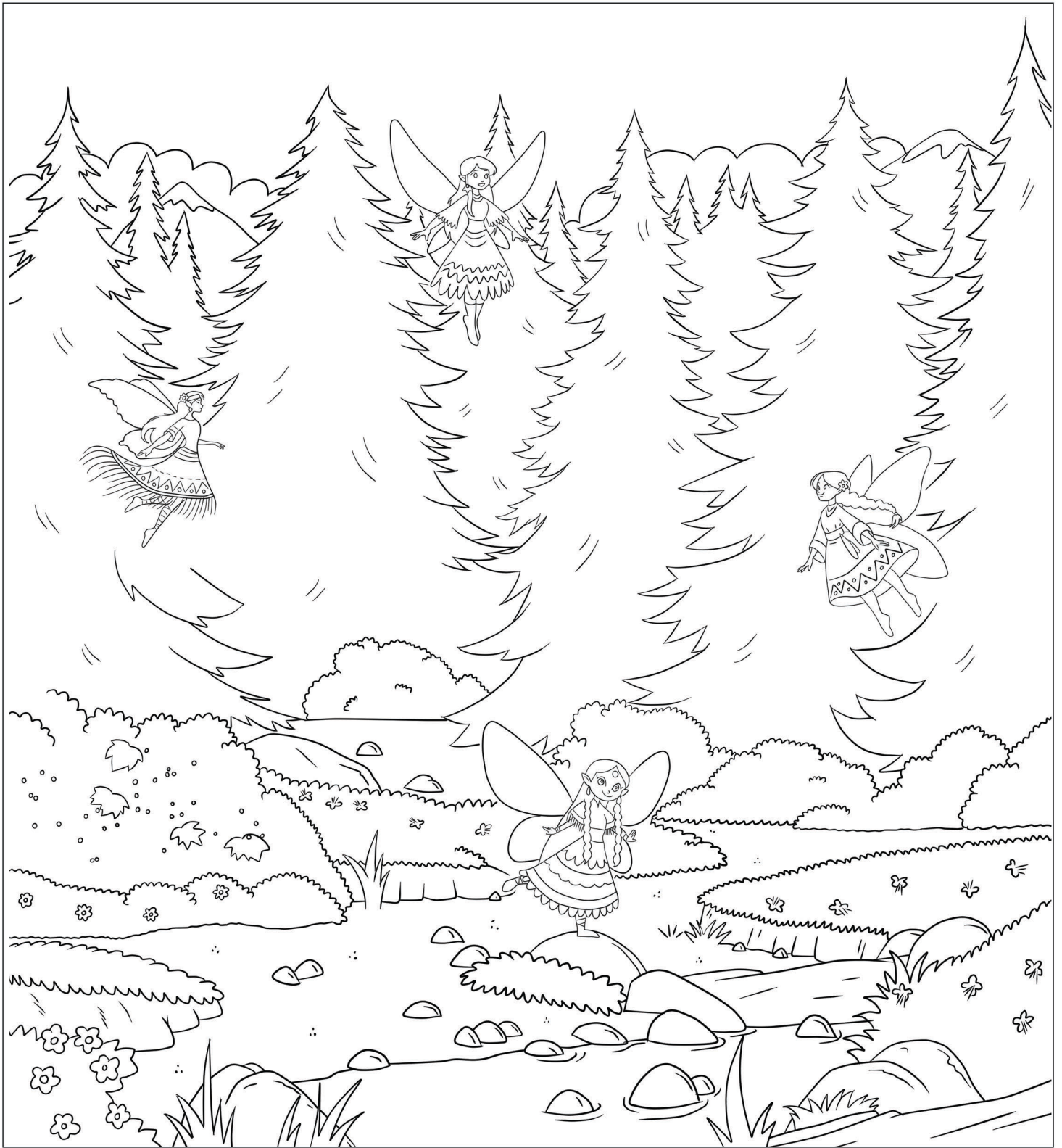

Fun Facts About River Otters



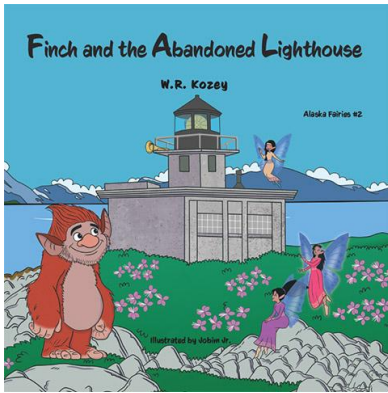
- Baby river otters are called **pups**.
- River otters are graceful and strong swimmers. They can swim about 6 mph.
- They can dive up to 60 feet under water and stay under for over 4 minutes!
- They can run about as fast as a person on land, but if it is snowy or icy they can move up to 15 mph with a combination of running and sliding.
- Both young and old river otters are very playful. They will play with "toys" like rocks and sticks, play tag, slide in the mud or snow, and wrestle and dunk each other.
